#### Objective 3:

Develop new relationships and partnerships with individuals and organizations outside oral health.

#### Tactics:

- Invite more health equity stakeholders to the table and create opportunities for engagement
- Proactively develop partnerships that align with MOHC's mission
- Connect stakeholders with one another
- Provide technical assistance to stakeholders as they develop and implement oral health programs in their communities

#### Objective 4:

Convert oral health data into materials that spur action among stakeholders.

#### Tactics:

• Proactively use Minnesota Oral Health Statistics System

- Improve website configuration to make information more easily accessible
- Structure resources as a "tool box"
- Include imagery more reflective of diverse populations
- Provide accessible materials suitable for social media posts
- Use redesign as an opportunity to promote the MOHC, its priorities, programs, members, partners, board of directors, etc.
- Consider consumer oral health information section

#### Objective 4:

# Create an oral health leadership program.

#### Tactics:

- Compile list of preferred skills and knowledge essential for oral health leadership over the next decade
- Conduct informal listening sessions with various types of dental practices, BIPOC communities, dental schools, state and local governments, and oral health associations about necessity for future leaders
- Partner with professional and membership associations to create continuing education courses for oral health

#### Objective 4:

Increase attendance and participation at annual conference and regional meetings.

#### Tactics:

- Work with conference planning volunteers
- Seek input from stakeholders on conference/meeting topics
- Select speakers and sponsors from inside and outside oral health
- Promote conferences among members and beyond
- Assure that continuing education credits are included in all conference offerings

#### Objective 4:

Develop a Whole-person Integrated Care Toolkit for Minnesota.

#### Tactics:

- Develop a Minnesota-centered toolkit modeled after Colorado's Integrated Medical Dental Integration Toolkit
- Research model projects and examples of administration of integrated practices such as records, billing, coding, forms, payments, etc.
- Promote lessons from behavioral health on how to integrate care, especially administrative tasks
- Identify benefits of integrated care to insurance providers
- Identify evidence-based changes to curriculum at medical and dental schools that promote integration
